The Beginning of our New Journey


Since January 2017, the school has had 5 core values.


These values were chosen as they are clear and distinct shared human, British values. All stakeholders in our school family are able to approach these from a position of some understanding, from our youngest pupils to our most experienced members of staff and this is regardless of their faith background. What makes us unique and distinctly Christian, is the way in which these are explored, developed and embedded through everything we do.

Each half term focuses on a different school value. The way this is explained and made meaningful to the children is through the associated Christian Values and in turn, theological basis, stories and layers of understanding. The children bring a human, shared understanding of our values. We add to this and develop it by telling them stories from the Bible, Bible scripture and by using Biblical figures and contemporary examples. In this way, the Christian meaning is assimilated into their understanding and enriches it. Our values are made meaningful and are developed and explored through the focus of Christianity.

These values are well embedded throughout the school. They are meaningful to pupils and underpin our approach to all aspects of our school. Because they are so well established, understood by all stakeholders and apt for our setting, we have decided to keep them.









Our Governors have been involved in the process too. They were asked to rank statements they felt were important to the ethos of the school at their different committees. These were their favourites:


We aim to give our pupils the best start, preparing them for a successful future.

A Story About Planting Seed

Mark 4: 1-20

Another time Jesus began teaching by the lake. A great crowd gathered around him. So he got into a boat and went out on the lake. All the people stayed on the shore close to the water. Jesus used many stories to teach them. He said, "Listen! A farmer went out to plant his seed. While the farmer was planting, some seed fell by the road. The birds came and ate all that seed. Some seed fell on rocky ground where there wasn't much dirt. The seed grew very fast there because the ground was not deep. ⁶ But when the sun rose, the plants withered. The plants died because they did not have deep roots. 7 Some other seed fell among thorny weeds. The weeds grew and choked the good plants. So those plants did not make grain. Some other seed fell on good ground. In the good ground, the seed began to grow. It grew and made a crop of grain. Some plants made 30 times more grain, some 60 times more grain, and some 100 times more grain."
